MYTHILI BHUSNURMATH is an economist-turned banker-turned journalist. She has done her masters from the Delhi School of Economics and is a Certified Associate of the Indian Institute of Bankers. After working for almost 16 years in the State Bank of India and the Reserve Bank of India, she moved to journalism. For a number of years, she was the edit-page editor with *The Economic Times*, the largest-selling business daily in India with a circulation of over 700,000. In 2004 she moved to *The Financial Express* as editor, becoming the first woman editor of a financial daily in India.

In her present position as Consulting Editor, *The Economic Times*, Ms. Bhusmurmth writes editorials mostly on macroeconomics, finance and banking, and also writes two regular columns – a fortnightly column, “Financestreet,” for the editorial page of the paper and a weekly column, “Kaleidoscope,” on a range of issues, often not remotely connected with economics or finance, in the *Sunday Economic Times*. She also writes for the policy page of the paper.
